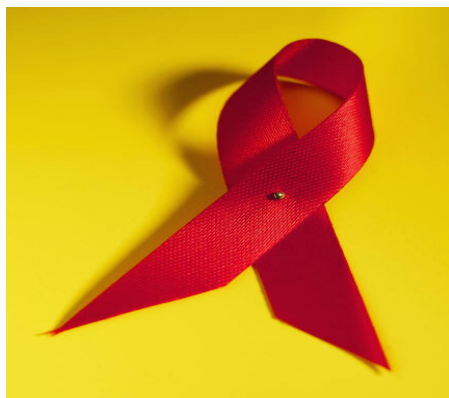
to be done, in the fight against HIV/AIDS.

.....continues the tradition of National Access Awareness Week first established in 1988 to promote better community access for people with disabilities. This campaign happened in response to a request from Rick Hansen following his Man in Motion World Tour. For ten years, a national committee coordinated planning for the week in communities all over Canada.

More than half a billion persons are disabled as a result of mental, physical or sensory impairment and no matter which part of the world they are in, their lives are often limited by physical or social barriers.

Much has been accomplished during the past two decades in promoting “equality” and “full participation” of disabled persons in social life and development.

Agreement in Principle for Residential School Survivors

On November 20, AFN National Chief Phil Fontaine signed an Agreement in Principle with the Government of Canada. The purpose is to lead and contribute to reconciliation, respect and recognition for Residential School Survivors. Survivors are eligible for compensation; even those involved in Class Action Lawsuits. Applications for the elderly will be fast tracked.
